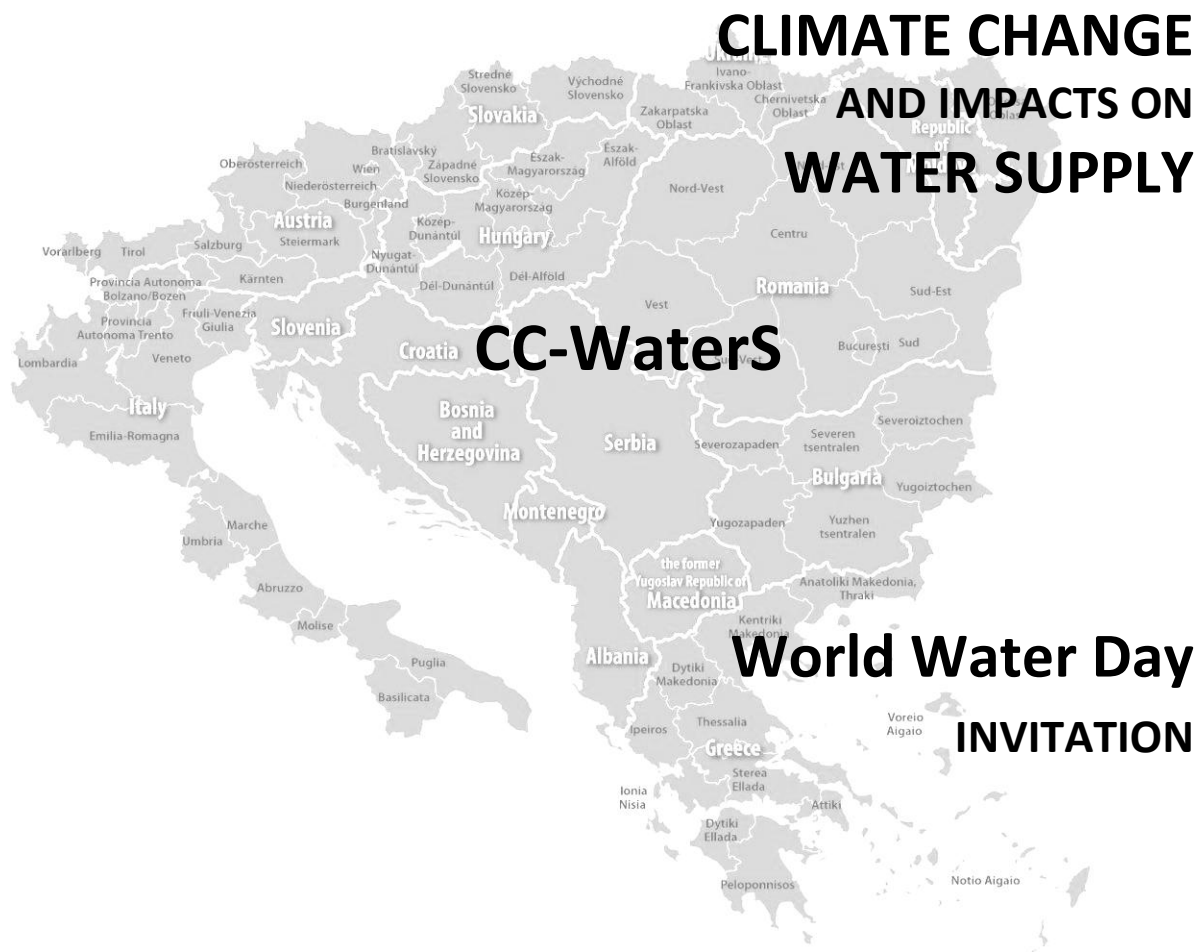

CC-WaterS the project **Climate change and impacts on water supply**

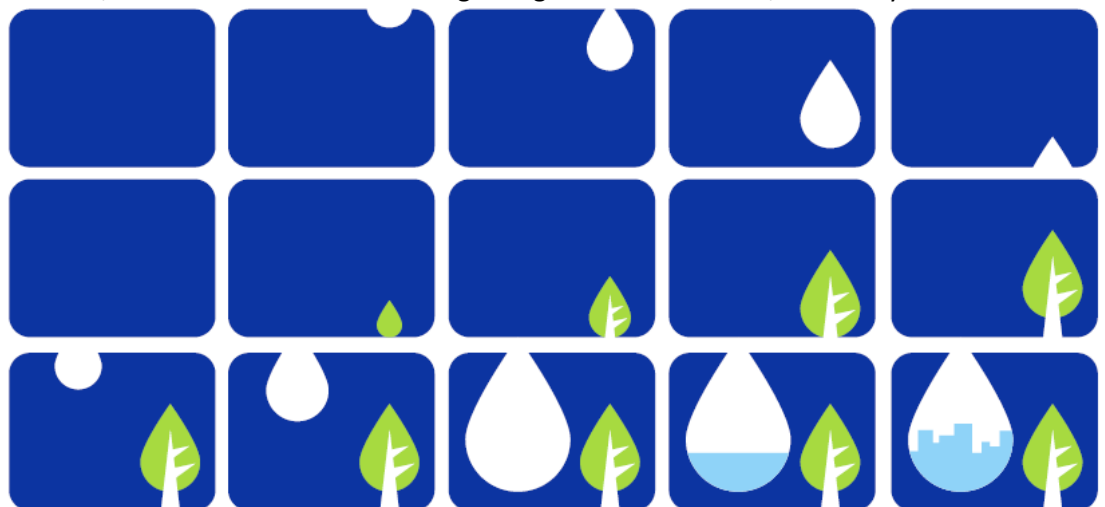
Climate change affects fresh water resources and may have significant influence on public drinking water supply. Land use activities exert pressure on water resources and are changing according to climate change.

The South East European area (SEE) is facing the challenge of ensuring water supply in a changing climate. Policy makers and water suppliers are required to develop sustainable management practices for water resources, considering existing and future influences of climate change. Therefore, CC-WaterS identifies and evaluates resulting impacts on availability and safety of public drinking water supply for several future decades.

Elaborated measures to adapt to those changes build the ground for a Water Supply Management System regarding optimisation of water extraction, land use restrictions, and socio-economic consequences.

In CC-WaterS, SEE key actors work together and implement jointly developed solutions to be applied on regional and local level in SEE. Moreover, policy makers and water suppliers develop a proposal on legislative guidelines and improvement potential for the SEE area.
